Health Science Librarians of Illinois President's Report Summer Board Meeting

July 28, 2021

While the annual conference is typically the focus of presidential duties, this year that has been eclipsed by the tax-exempt status of our organization. It was discovered that HSLI's tax-exempt status had been revoked and that efforts to reinstate it had not been successful. The Board met in April to discuss next steps and all agreed that it would be beneficial to hire a CPA. Carmen Howard and Liesl Cottrell sent inquiries and two CPAs responded. The board met again in June and decided to meet with Raj Nagaraja of ATA Group. Laura Wimmer, Geoff Pettys and I met with Raj and Paul Inserra in July. They seemed very knowledgeable about what needed to be done to get HSLI reinstated and I sent an email to the board members for approval or rejection.

The 2021 conference committee decided to hold the conference virtually. It is scheduled for October 27-29. The committee is also looking into holding virtual coffee hours to discuss topics of interest. The contract with Starved Rock Lodge & Conference Center was again shifted to the following year and the conference will take place on September 7 - 9, 2022, at Starved Rock. Our deposit of \$2925 remains with the Lodge. Any member room reservations rolled over to 2022 unless cancelled by the member.

In April, HSLI held a community gathering event at which Jacqueline Leskovec presented on the NNLM Regional Update.

The board, via an online survey, approved changing corporate (vendor) membership fees to the regular membership fee level.

Ideas were requested for the new HSLI logo with nothing new presented.

The discussion about financial support for Lightning Talks was tabled. While the survey results were evenly split between providing or not providing a stipend, it is not applicable for this year as the conference will be virtual.

Geoff Petty resigned as treasurer and Laura Wimmer was appointed interim.

Kirstin Duffin stepped down as Legislative Committee co-chair as of June 30, and Lesley Wolfgang has volunteered to fill that position.

Ramune Kubilius was appointed liaison to Special Library Association – IL.

Task force appointed for the Jira Scholarship Fund to determine how to market the scholarship, develop an application process, and set the amount of the initial award.

CARLI received a \$1.08 million award for the Open Textbooks Pilot Grant. The grant period is three years. HSLI had offered support of this endeavor and our responsibilities include dissemination of project information through established channels, and representation on Illinois SCOERs Advisory Committee.

Tax-Exempt Status:

HSLI's tax-exempt status was revoked in 2010 due to the Organization's failure to submit IRS Form 990-N for the three years prior. Dianne Olson submitted IRS Form 1023 in late 2010/early 2011 and HSLI was granted retroactive reinstatement.

IRS Form 990-N was submitted in 2012, 2013, and 2014 in compliance with IRS policy, but was not submitted in 2015, 2016, or 2017. This led to HSLI's tax-exempt status being revoked as of May 2017.

In order for HSLI's status to be reinstated, HSLI must:

- 1. Submit IRS Form 1023 (along with the \$600 application fee)
- 2. Include with the application a "Reasonable Cause Statement," explaining the circumstances that led to the revocation and the steps that will be taken to avoid this happening again in the future.
- 3. File the appropriate forms for the years we did not file (2015-2021)

Because so much time has passed since the status revocation, HSLI may not be eligible for retroactive reinstatement. If this is the case, there may be additional penalties for 2017-present, during which HSLI would have been considered a taxable organization.

Illinois Attorney General

It was also discovered that HSLI has never filed Form AG990-IL with the Attorney General's office, which is required of all Tax-Exempt organizations.

In order to be in compliance with the Illinois Attorney General's office HSLI needs to:

- 1. Submit Form AG990-IL (along with the \$15 registration fee and \$200 late registration fee)
- 2. Pay annual report filing fees (\$15/year) + late report fees (\$100/year) for the past three years

Recommendation

Due to amount of time that has passed since HSLI's tax-exempt status was revoked and the fact that this is the organization's second revocation, I strongly recommend that HSLI hire a CPA and a lawyer to help fill our IRS Form 1023. Form 1023 is quite lengthy and requires significant details concerning HSLI's past activities. It *may* be possible for someone form the organization to complete this form, but HSLI would greatly benefit from having a CPA review it before submitting to the IRS, if not completing it entirely. Moreover, professional input from either a CPA, an attorney, or both is highly advised when writing the "Reasonable Cause Statement." Doing so will ensure that the form includes the language that the IRS is looking for and will provide HSLI with the best chances of getting back into the good graces of the IRS. Professional assistance will also help demonstrate our earnest desire to prevent future failures and could potentially result in some fees being waived.

Bills and other legislative items

- House Bill 3202 HEALTH ED-E-CIGARETTES has been sent to the Governor to sign. This bill
 amends "the Critical Health Problems and Comprehensive Health Education Act. Adds ecigarettes and other vapor devices as one of the educational areas the Comprehensive Health
 Education Program must include." (https://legiscan.com/IL/bill/HB3202/2021)
- House Bill 0158 sent to the Governor. HB158 has a lot in it so here is a summary from Legiscan: "Creates the Community Health Worker Certification and Reimbursement Act. Amends various Acts regarding medical staff credentials; electronic posters and signs; N95 masks; Legionella bacteria testing; continuing education on implicit bias awareness; overdoses; the Prescription Monitoring Program; a dementia training program; taxation of blood sugar testing materials; funding of safety-net hospitals; a Child Care Assistance Program Eligibility Calculator; managed care organizations; Federally Qualified Health Centers; care coordination; billing; the Medicaid Business Opportunity Commission; reimbursement rates; doula services; personal care of family members; the State Health Assessment; the State Health Improvement Plan; child care training; and a Medicaid Managed Care Oversight Commission. Creates the Behavioral Health Workforce Education Center of Illinois Act. Creates the Underlying Causes of Crime and Violence Study Act. Creates the Special Commission on Gynecologic Cancer Act. Creates the Racial Impact Note Act to require the estimate of the impact on racial and ethnic minorities of certain bills. Creates the Health and Human Services Task Force and Study Act to review health and human service departments and programs. Creates the Anti-Racism Commission Act concerning elimination of systemic racism. Creates the Sickle Cell Prevention, Care, and Treatment Program Act regarding programs and other matters. Amends the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act in relation to the Health Facilities and Services Review Board, facility closure, and other matters. Creates the Medicaid Technical Assistance Act. Repeals, adds, and changes other provisions. Effective immediately." (https://legiscan.com/IL/bill/HB0158/2021)

Update: House Bill 158 was signed into law in April as <u>Public Act 102-0004 – HEALTH CARE & HUMAN SERVICES</u>. Ruby Mendenhall answers questions and provides highlights from the act in this <u>brief interview</u>. Mendenhall is a University of Illinois professor of African American studies and sociology and the assistant dean for diversity and democratization of health innovation at the Carle Illinois College of Medicine.

Senate Bill 4207 and House Bill 5867 – Senate Assistant Majority Leader Dave Koehler, D-Peoria, and state House Assistant Majority Leader Fred Crespo, D-Hoffman Estates, have filed bills in the House and Senate requiring that Managed Care Organizations return unused funds to the state for redistribution (SB4207 and HB5867.) Koehler and Crespo state that this need for a redistribution of funds is in response to lower use of elective and outpatient services and an

• Ask your reps to support <u>Build America's Libraries Act</u> [ALA, 4/21]

Bills passed

- H.R.133 Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 [Public Law No. 116-260, 12/27/20]
 FY21 funding for relevant agencies are:
 - \$463,787,000 allocated to the National Library of Medicine (up from \$456.9 million in FY20)
 - \$338,000,000 allocated to the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (level with FY20 funding)
 - \$257,000,000 allocated to the Institute of Museum and Library Services (an increase from \$252 million in FY20)
 - \$59,563,000 to the National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled (an increase from \$58.6 million in FY20)

Funding for other institutes of the NIH and health care agencies appear on pp. 392-400. COVID relief details are under Subtitle B–COVID-related Tax Relief Act of 2020 beginning on p. 783. The No Surprises Act to prevent surprise medical bills, p. 1576+.

- H.R.4704 Advancing Research to Prevent Suicide Act [Public Law No. 116-339, 1/13/21]
 Directs the National Science Foundation (NSF) to award competitive, merit-reviewed grants to institutions of higher education (or their consortia) to support multidisciplinary, fundamental research with potential relevance to suicide, including potential relevance to prevention and treatment.
- H.R.3153 EFFORT (Expanding Findings for Federal Opioid Research and Treatment) Act [Public Law No. 116-335, 1/13/21]
 Directs the National Science Foundation to support merit-reviewed and competitively awarded research on the science of opioid addiction.
- H.R.1418 Competitive Health Insurance Reform Act of 2020 [Public Law No. 116-327, 1/13/21]
 Declares that nothing in the McCarran-Ferguson Act modifies, impairs, or supersedes the operation of antitrust laws with respect to the business of health insurance, including the business of dental insurance.
- <u>H.R.1319 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021</u> [Public Law No. 117-2, 3/11/21] Provides funding and provisions related to COVID-19 relief.
- <u>S.937 COVID-19 Hate Crimes Act</u> [Public Law No. 117-3, 5/20/21]
 To facilitate the expedited review of COVID-19 hate crimes, and for other purposes. DOJ and the Department of Health and Human Services must issue guidance aimed at raising awareness of hate crimes during the COVID-19 (i.e., coronavirus disease 2019) pandemic.
- <u>H.R.941 TRANSPLANT Act of 2021</u> [Public Law No. 117-15, 5/26/21]
 To reauthorize the Stem Cell Therapeutic and Research Act of 2005, and for other purposes.

We currently have 14 life members (7 retired; 7 still employed)

4. Membership Directory:

The directory is generated from the Access Database that maintains the membership records. The current revision of the 2021 directory, dated 7/2/21, was sent to the webmaster for posting to the HSLI Website on 7/6/21. This directory contains all renewals received to that date. At this time the 2020 directory is still being maintained on the website.

The HSLI Directory is password protected (member 2021). The password is intended only to lower the risk of unauthorized harvesting of member contact information, not as a comprehensive security device.

The final directory for each membership year is sent to the Chair of the HSLI Archives Committee.

Membership applications are maintained by the membership committee and provided to the HSLI Webmaster for posting to the website. The current revision allows for the purchase of life memberships. The ability to pay online with

PayPal was incorporated in May 2018, payment by PayPal includes payment of a \$1.00 convenience fee in order for HSLI to maintain its current level of dues revenue.

Shown below is the year-by-year number of posts since inception of the online *HSLI Newsletter* in July, 2010. From 2017 through 2019, the annual total has held steady at around 600 posts, ranging from 584 to 616. The number of posts fell below this range in 2020. The decrease may reflect the pandemic's effect on activities in the scope of the Newsletter content (e.g., conferences, other professional activities). Based on the number of posts at the time of this report, it is expected the total will be return to the higher range seen prior to 2020.

Analysis of the cumulative indexing is shown in the table on page 2 of this report. The average number of times a category was assigned to posts was approximately 175; the median was 29. Highlighted in gray in the table, and listed immediately below in descending order, are the categories assigned more than the average number of times. With one exception, all of them have regularly been among the top-assigned categories when compared to the past analyses. The newcomer to the group of most assigned categories is "Committees (non-HSLI)".

Highlighted in orange in the table are categories with continually low or plateaued assignment. Not included in this analysis of most- and least-used categories are the ones for the HSLI conferences because the applicability of each one is for a specific year. The less-used categories may mirror trends in news of lessening relevance or interest. To represent the name change for the Greater Midwest Region NN/LM, a new category was added, "NNLM Region 6".

Posts were authored and/or published primarily by Co-editor and Newsletter Committee member Eric Edwards. Publishing rights remain available to other HSLI Board members, and the Committee will publish on behalf of others. In continued support of communication and collaboration with IACRL, the Committee shared the information contained in *Newsletter* blog posts with the IACRL listserv, and also with regional and national discussion lists (GMR, MLA, ACRL, etc.) when appropriate.

The established process for publication and promotion has continued to be reliable.


