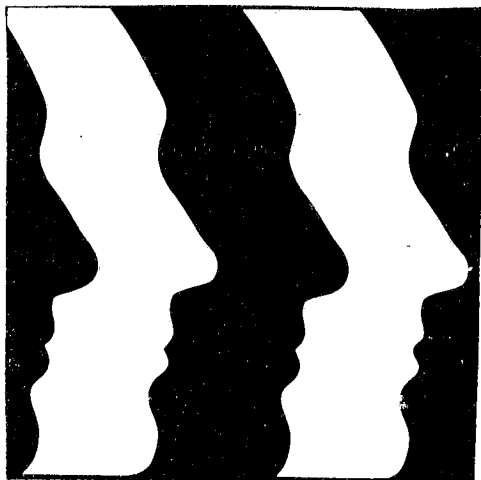

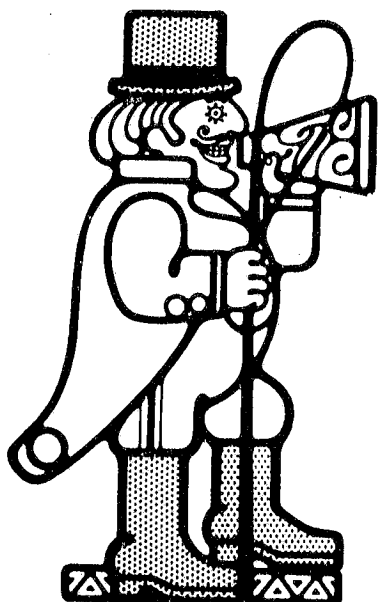

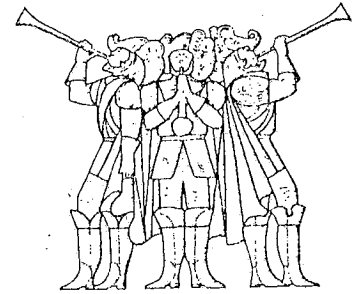

For those of you who might not have noticed, thought you'd be interested in the following excerpt from the Federal Register, July 5, 1985, Vol. 50, No. 129, page 27722:

"Costs of on-the-job training, maintenance of a medical library and certain other activities are considered normal operating costs and are included in the calculation of the prospective payment rate."

This is the first time I've been able to find anything definitive about this issue. I realize, and your accounting department will tell you, that it's lost in the system, so to speak; but it's the principle that counts! If anyone else has seen anything relevant, I'd be interested in hearing from them.

This will be a fun night to relax after a day of travel and class. Plan to join us!

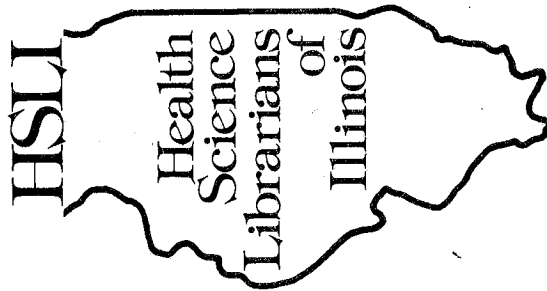
### AIRPORT HOLIDAY INN

# MANAGEMENT: FUTILITY OR UTILITY?

**PURPOSE**

This unique two-day program will permit expanded opportunities to learn effective approaches to management. Thursday, Sept. 26, the program will consist of a full day on the basics of management and the techniques of problem-solving and decision-making. Friday, Sept. 27, two briefer program segments will continue the theme with presentations on goal setting and communication skills.

**CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDIT**

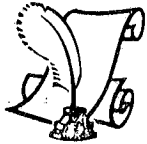

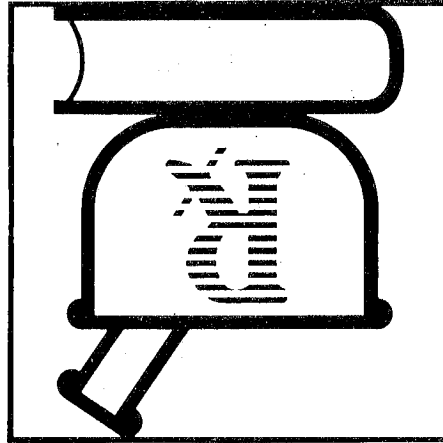
